WAG has been in existence for 16 years and my wish is that the group grows and continues to serve the arts & crafts community of the Shire.

The current situation with COVID-19 has interrupted our function as a group and put even more stress upon us. My position is that the members (many in their 70s) not be put at risk in any way, therefore most social functions and workshops organised by WAG are on hold until we have the confidence to

Wollondilly Shire Council wisely cancelled The 2020 Illuminate Festival of Light. WAG auspices the art exhibition and artisan market as part of the festival. An offer was made to WAG to instead, hold the illuminate art exhibition and artisan market at the old Picton Post Office on September 19th. The offer was accepted by the Committee at the time but on reflection not such a good idea, due to the risk involved to the organisers and the public as the virus gains pace.

The Annual Member's Art Exhibition will possibly not proceed this year. We are currently investigating the wisdom and cost of setting up a virtual gallery. The group (and the Community) has lost the use of the Shire gallery art spaces as the new precinct area is developed and Council and their offices are moved

into the Shire Hall. The new space indicated on the precinct plan is inadequate as gallery space.

Although we were initially consulted about the Cultural Precinct Grant plans and also submitted feedback about the needs of WAG and cultural groups, we feel that the outcome is so far not addressing the needs of WAG or the cultural community in general. We are looking forward to discussing this at a planned meeting with Williams Ross Architects in the near future.

The Annual General Meeting is also on hold until it is safe to proceed.

Pam reflects on her pandemic break:

"It was interesting to come to my painting some time into the pandemic but I went to a friend's farm for nearly four weeks at the start and picked quinces and made jam and paste... crocheted with string garlic and chilli bags to hang in kitchen... collected sheep bones in long walks to make my first sculpture... experimented with besan flour... handled fluent light and soft sheep fleeces as a 'roust about'... collected plants, flowers, did some observation drawing and painting. All based in a small stone cottage, alone, on the farm, only the length of the driveway from the main house. How very calming... a wonderful awareness of the embracing quiet and the passage of time." kitchen table during lock down. Painted on a white earthenware clay tile with underglazes and clear glaze on top fired to 1,120°C. with lots of coffee, cake, patience and isolation. Cheers from Tony Walsh.

"When I realised we were in for an enforced period at home I enrolled in an online workshop with 'Fibre Arts Take Two' and artist Tara Axford in mixed media. Titled 'Inspired by Nature', we received ideas and instructions by video and as print media and communicated via our own Facebook page. Tara is talented in many artforms so we have explored observations of our local area, photography, printmaking,



mono printing, collage and watercolour as mediums and artist books and book art in addition. It has been fun swapping examples and ideas with artists from across Australia as well as UK, Canada, New Zealand the Netherlands and

Arizona! I have discovered the fun and possibilities in collage and have attached one example of a rock in Thirlmere Lakes National Park!" Kind regards
