PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Summer wasn't a normal Summer in 2022/23, the weather patterns have altered and Summer appears to have moved to Autumn judging by the confusion plant life is showing. Not a lot occurred in the holiday period, however in WagWorld, planning for ARTS events continued for the year ahead.

COVID is still with us – as our Government of all flavours appear not too concerned about it – I guess no one really is! Inflation, the Cost of Living and the State election are replacing the media headlines from the invasion of Ukraine, the war being a root cause of our ongoing economic and social problems along with the pandemic.

As a result of the above, social interaction and interest in volunteering has waned - the demand on the services of Charitable Organisations (COs) and Not for Profits (NFPs) is compounding. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the rate of volunteering through an organisation or group in Australia fell sharply from 29.5% in 2019 to 24.8% in 2020. A survey* on the impact of COVID-19 on volunteering found that only slightly more than half (56.4%) of those who stopped volunteering in 2020 resumed in the 12 months leading up to April 2021, despite the easing of lock downs and social distancing restrictions in many jurisdictions in Australia at that time.

According to the 2021 'Pulse of the For-Purpose Sector' survey, 31% of organisations that engage volunteers indicated that they had fewer volunteers than six months prior. A similar rate was found in the 2020 survey. When asked, the vast majority of NFPs & COs that engage volunteers indicated that they needed volunteers (84%), and that they were experiencing a demand for volunteer-led services (59%). * https://www.volunteeringaustralia. org/wp-content/uploads/VA-Key-Volunteering-Statistics-2022-Update. pdf
