

There was a little girl, Who had a little curl, Right in the middle of her forehead. When she was good, She was very very good, But when she was bad she was horrid. Well, some may say horrid. I would replace 'horrid' with the word 'Bipolar'.

Sue began drifting into dementia early 2023, we were having to call her to remind her of event days and she started to forget simple tasks, it was so sad to experience this – it was all too quick.

Sue was loosing balance and had a fall after a family Mother's day lunch at Mittagong RSL and was admitted to Bowral hospital.

Sue's condition deteriorated, apart from forgetting her Bipolar

medication, Sue was also forgetting to take her diabetes medication, not eating and drinking fluids with assistance. Sue could not remember names, however, according to Jean Mills who made regular visits, enjoyed the photo Jean gave her of Cleo*, Sue's cat.

In early June Sue was admitted to Anthem Aged Care in Bowral where she passed away peacefully aged 74 years.

On behalf of WAG, I would like to express my condolences to Sue's family along with our gratitude to WAG Committee Member and President of the local Writer's Guild, Jean Mills for her care and visits to Sue. Also to Elizabeth Atkin for writing and delivering a superb eulogy at Sue's funeral service.
